2011 - 2012 HIGHLIGHTS

In addition to our "Music at St. Mary's" concert series, The Harlem Chamber Players also joined the NYC Housing Authority Symphony Orchestra in their 40th Anniversary Gala Concert at Zankel Hall at Carnegie Hall.

Long-time patron of minority musicians, founder of NYCHA Orchestra, and founding board member of The Harlem Chamber Players, Janet Wolfe, who turned 98 in April, was also honored at the Carnegie Hall concert.

This concert featured the world-renowned pianist and conductor Awadagin Pratt, the first African-American pianist to win the Naumburg International Piano Competition.

WQXR's Terrance McKnight hosted the event and returned to host our 4th Annual Black History Month Celebration.

The Harlem Chamber Players also joined Opus 118 Harlem School of Music in a joint Winter Holiday Concert. This concert featured the faculty and students of the celebrated violin teacher Roberta Guaspari, the inspiration behind the award-winning documentary *Small Wonders* and Miramax's film, *Music of the Heart*, starring Meryl Streep.

Members of The Harlem Chamber Players also presented a sneak preview of our **Harlem BACH Project** at Dance Theatre of Harlem's Sunday Matinée Finale.

The Harlem Chamber Players also gave a free outdoor concert at West Harlem Piers as part of the "Summer on the Hudson Lunchtime Listen Series," sponsored by the New York City Parks Department.
