On Palm Sunday, April 13, 2014, The Harlem Chamber Players partnered with the Convent Avenue Baptist Church Sanctuary Choir in presenting the omnipotent masterpiece, the Mozart *Requiem Mass in D Minor* to a packed church of nearly 500 people. Gregory Hopkins, who is both the music minister of Convent Avenue Baptist Church and the artistic director of Harlem Opera Theater, introduced The Harlem Chamber Players to Morningside Opera. We are looking forward to working with both Morningside Opera and Harlem Opera Theater in presenting Harry Lawrence Freeman's opera *Voodoo* this upcoming season.
